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Palliative Care & Advance Care Planning Program

Sansum Clinic is establishing a **Palliative Care and Advance Care Planning Program** with the goal of enhancing the quality of life for our patients who are being treated for a serious illness. The program will address the physical, emotional, social and spiritual needs by facilitating patient autonomy and access to information. The palliative care team will explore the patients understanding about their illness and prognosis and will help them clarify their treatment goals and wishes, and provide care to those who need their expertise.

The primary services will be provided within Sansum Clinic's **Ridley-Tree Cancer Center** and, over time, will also extend to patients homes, hospital, skilled nursing facilities, and other Sansum Clinic locations, following the patient wherever they may need care. Advance Care Planning would be an integral part of the program with a goal of aligning medical care with the individual patient's preferences – "that people get the care they need and no less, and the care they want and no more". A social worker will be a certified ACP provider and will incorporate advance



care planning, as well as completion of advance directives, and if appropriate, POLST documentation, as part of the program.

The Palliative Care Team will thoroughly address the patients' pain and comfort care issues. They will engage patients in meaningful discussion about healthcare goals and preferences, including advance care planning and end of life goals and ensure patients have appropriate/early access to hospice and other critical patient-oriented programs as their disease progresses. They will also coordinate with primary care and other care providers who are part of the patient's medical team.

The Ridley-Tree Cancer Center cares for approximately **75% to 80%** of the oncology patients in the area. Sansum Clinic cares for a large number of pulmonary, cardiology, rheumatology and neurology patients in the community. We anticipate that approximately **60%** of the program will serve patients with cancer, and approximately **40%** of the program will serve patients with neurological conditions, such as ALS and dementia; and patients with cardiac, respiratory, kidney, liver or other organ dysfunction or failure, such as congestive heart failure, COPD or end-stage renal disease.

Evidence from multiple large clinical trials shows early palliative care improves the quality of life (enhanced pain and symptom control), reduces depression and improves satisfaction with care. For hospitalized patients, palliative care reduces the length of stay, the number and duration of ICU stays and readmission rates and emergency room use. The program increases use and length of stay in hospice. For patients near the end of life, palliative care reduces the use of invasive and aggressive treatments and increases enrollment and length of stay in hospice, while actually improving survival.

By engaging patients early in the disease course, clinic based Palliative Care services support patients, over time, in achieving maximum symptom control and

in making informed choices about which health services they wish to utilize and in which settings.

Studies have shown that patients who receive early, clinic based palliative care often consume fewer and more appropriate health care services and indicate greater satisfaction with their care, compared to patients who receive no palliative care. The Palliative Care and Advance Care Planning Program will be a multidisciplinary program that "touches" all departments within Sansum Clinic and the Ridley-Tree Cancer Center.

The administrative oversight for the program will be provided by **Matt Kunkel, VP Operations** at Ridley-Tree Cancer. Matt was involved in setting up the Palliative Care

Program at Palo Alto Medical Foundation prior to joining the Sansum Clinic team in 2016.

The clinical programmatic oversight and interdisciplinary outreach will be provided by **Dr. Marjorie Newman, Medical Director**, with input from various clinical departments within Sansum Clinic.We are currently recruiting for the Palliative Care team and anticipate the program being fully operational by October 2019.

Let's Talk: Putting Advance Care Planning into Practice

In May, Sansum Clinic hosted a free **Advance Care Planning** (ACP) seminar in partnership with the Coalition for Compassionate Care of California (CCCC) entitled *Let's Talk:* Putting Advance Care Planning into Practice to train healthcare providers in ACP education, skills training and support. This training was designed to increase ACP knowledge, expertise and conversation skills for ACP discussions to ensure conversations occur with greater regularity and earlier in the course of a patient's care.

The audience included a mix of Sansum Clinic and community primary care physicians, specialty physicians, nurse practitioners and physician assistants, and covered ACP activities that ideally occur over the course of a person's lifetime or health trajectory, best practices for using the **Physician's Orders for Life-Sustaining Treatment (POLST)** form, specific techniques for facilitating conversations about goals of care, and how a medical practice team could approach implementing an ACP process for their patients.

The event was led by Marjorie Newman, MD, Medical Director of Sansum Clinic, and featured speakers Lael C. Duncan, MD, Medical Director of CCCC, and Shirley Otis-Green, MSW, MA, ACSW, LCSW, OSW-C, Clinical Director of CCCC. Cottage Health was the title sponsor. Participants were eligible for continuing medical education (CME) credits through the Santa Barbara County Consortium for CME, which is accredited by the Institute for Medical Quality/California Medical Association (IMQ/CMA) to provide continuing medical education for physicians.

A second event was held for social workers, hospice staff, and other healthcare professionals, to provide the tools to begin a quality Advance Care Planning experience with patients and their families, to help align patients' own goals and preferences with their medical care and treatment. This will result in a better experience for patients whose wishes will be honored, and it will also lead to

more effective and efficient use of medical resources, including reducing hospital readmissions, improving communication between different entities involved in a patient's care, and more effective use of valuable tools like POLST.

Ongoing Advance Care Planning Services

Sansum Clinic and Ridley-Tree Cancer Center offer workshops and individual consultations for patients and families to explore values, goals, beliefs and preferences for healthcare and for assistance in completing an **Advance Directive document**.

In 2018, more than 100 patients, family members or caregivers met with Advance Care Planning Facilitator, **Rev. Laura Mancuso**, to:

- Select a qualified healthcare agent to act on their behalf
- Explore their values, goals, beliefs and preferences for healthcare
- Understand their current health status and expected course of illness
- Document the name of their healthcare agent and preferences in a My Care
 Advance Directive
- Complete a POLST if appropriate
- Share decisions with loved ones and healthcare providers
- Record their Advance Care Plan in the electronic health record



Patients are also referred to **Advance Care Planning** as part of our **Care Management Program**. Advance Care Planning is presented in collaboration with **Alliance for Living and Dying Well**, and this service is free of charge.




Care Management Program

Care management ensures that care is provided to individuals as seamlessly as possible and minimizes the potential for duplication of services. In 2018, **Care Manager Christine Cruse, MSW, ASW** assisted **682 patients** in managing their health condition by helping them prioritize their healthcare needs and offering support in navigating an increasingly complex healthcare system. Patients and their family members act as "partners in care" with the Care Manager by identifying their personal goals, engaging in education, and participating in strategies to facilitate compliance.

Special attention is placed on care planning and self-care support. A self-care plan serves as a "road map" to improving health. The Care Manager shares the plan with the patient's primary care provider, and works closely with patients to:

- Incorporate preferences, and include current issues, medications and allergies.
- Connect patients with the Prescription Navigator to ensure safe and effective use of medications if applicable.
- Utilize lifestyle and treatment goals.
- Address potential barriers to meeting goals and strategies.



Advancements in Operations



Sansum Clinic's innovative **Prescription Navigator Program** assisted **1,359 patients** in managing medications and prescriptions in 2018. This pharmacist-led medication therapy management program ensures the safe, effective, and appropriate use of medications by Sansum Clinic and Ridley-Tree Cancer Center patients.

Prescription Navigator **Rania Shenoda, PharmD**, is well trained in the therapeutic uses and effects of drugs and can help ensure appropriate medication use, reduce medication-related problems and improve health outcomes. The Prescription Navigator often works with caregivers or family members to give them a better understanding of medications they might help administer, and to guide them with setting up pill boxes for proper adherence to medication therapy. Our electronic health record system gives the Prescription Navigator the information needed to assist patients with their therapy through access to provider notes, lab work, and by communicating with providers about any concerns or recommendations.



The Prescription Navigator Program is generously underwritten by Julie Nadel, and is free of charge and open to patients of Sansum Clinic and Ridley-Tree Cancer Center.

In 2018, 122 patients self-referred to the program through the **Brown Bag Medication Review** program, which is designed for patients who take multiple medications or have any medication concerns. The pharmacist:

- Reviews all medications to ensure patients understand what has been prescribed and why
- Looks for adjustments that may increase the effectiveness of the therapy
- Screens for potential interactions or side effects
- Assures that the medication list is up to date
- Answers medication questions and discusses the risks and benefits of medications with a health professional

Hospital and Skilled Nursing Facility Discharge Medication Review Program

For Sansum Clinic patients who are discharged from the hospital or a skilled nursing facility, the Prescription Navigator contacts the patients or family members by telephone after discharge to conduct a comprehensive medication review and ensure they have all of the necessary medications needed at home. The Prescription Navigator ensures that the patient understands their medication regimen and any changes made by the providers at the hospital or skilled nursing facility since this can be confusing for patients at home. During this post discharge telephone consultation, the Prescription Navigator updates the medication list in the Sansum Clinic electronic health record system.

Medication Management for Patients with Diabetes

Lily Yip, PharmD, APh, CDE, BCACP, joined Sansum Clinic in 2018 to address a critical need among diabetes patients. As a medication therapy management pharmacist, Lily cares for patients referred by Sansum's six endocrinologists and two certified physician assistants (PA-Cs). Many of these patients require more education and an increased understanding of the prescriptions they take to maintain their health. As a certified diabetes educator, Lily is familiar with the depression, anxiety and guilt these patients can experience from the stresses of managing their disease.

In free consultations at the multi-specialty clinic at 215 Pesetas Lane, Lily reviews a patient's entire medical record and takes time to uncover important factors that might not have been shared with the physician. Lily says these talks reveal barriers that prevent people from taking their medication, like insurance coverage issues, drug side effects or financial struggles affecting the purchase of healthy food. Patients may have stopped seeing their primary care doctor, missed lab tests, failed to pick up prescriptions, are confused about a physician's advice or perhaps just need a helping hand to navigate their concerns. Lily works to bridge the gap between the patient and the medical team.

Armed with a doctorate from the University of Southern California School of Pharmacy and seven years experience working around Los Angeles in similar positions, Lily can order or change prescriptions and adjust doses. She combs through patient reports to find people who may have fallen through the cracks by not adhering to the medication protocol or skipping

appointments, knowing it often justtakes someone reaching out personally to change the situation. Lily, who is fluent in English, Spanish or Chinese, is passionate about her work and the patients.

Foothill Surgery Center at Sansum Clinic is one of the preeminent surgery centers in Santa Barbara, and continues to expand its high quality services in a cost-effective and friendly setting.

The surgical team has expanded to include a facial plastic surgeon, **Dr. Andrew Beckler**, an ocuplastic surgeon, **Dr. Mica Bergman**, and a pain management specialist, **Dr. Graham Reimer**.

In 2018, patient volumes increased between 10-30 %. Staff turnover remains less than 1%. The rate of infection remains less than 1%. The surgery center consistently scores in the mid-90s for patient satisfaction.


The Foothill Surgery Center was successfully reaccredited in 2017 for excellence in the delivery of care to our patients by the **Accreditation Association for Ambulatory Health Care (AAAHC),** an accreditation body established to advance and promote patient safety. We continue to uphold the standards required for this accreditation.



Advancements in Operations

Primary Care Provider Scorecards

Tracking clinical quality continues to be a central focus for Sansum Clinic, particularly in our Primary Care Departments. **Quality Scorecards** in **the Wave** provide real-time information regarding progress toward clinical quality goals. The data are easily visualized at the provider, department,



service line, and overall Clinic level. These reports promote partnership between care team members, clearly indicating opportunities for population outreach, education, or individual patient services. Being able to quickly realize these opportunities on the Scorecard enhances communication across the care team, promotes streamlined workflows, and enables the patient to remain at the focus of the care team while simultaneously ensuring the quality goals of the Clinic are met. Additionally, the scorecards provide a concise way for executive leadership to monitor the Clinic's quality performance and make data-driven operational decisions designed to achieve performance goals.



Press Ganey Patient Experience Surveys

Sansum Clinic has continued to partner with the research firm **Press Ganey**, a recognized leader in improving the patient experience, to listen to the feedback of our stakeholders, learn from that input, and lead targeted improvement to deliver exceptional patient experiences.

We have seen continuous improvement in our Press Ganey scores and the survey has helped us bring the 'patient voice' into our decision making process. The Executive Team reviews patient comments and uses the feedback to help focus our process improvement efforts. By putting the patient first, we not only improve the patient experience, but also consistently demonstrate high-performance across an array of metrics and measures.

The survey demonstrated that one of the Clinic's biggest opportunities in 2018 was to inform patients about delays, so each clinical site engaged their teams to develop an improved process to ensure we are consistently providing this information to patients throughout every step of their visit.

The five foundational components Sansum Clinic is focusing on to deliver efficient and effective care to patients are:

- Engaged and passionate leadership
- Safe, patient and family focused care
- Compassionate, competent caregivers
- Aligned stakeholders
- Reliable care and business process



In order to successfully deliver on the promise of safe, high-quality, patient-centered care, health care organizations like Sansum Clinic are being challenged to raise performance across all of these attributes simultaneously.

Our partnership with Press Ganey has offered Sansum Clinic access to the industry's largest healthcare performance databases — including comparative customer feedback, actionable survey data and improvement resources — to help drive targeted performance improvement.

Operational Efficiency Task Force

Keeping trend with recent years, 2018 was a time of continued change within the healthcare landscape. We are focused on continuous improvement of all that we do, so we must adapt our delivery system to meet the needs of our patients while ensuring a sustainable future for the organization.

The Sansum Clinic Executive Team – in partnership with the Board of Trustees – initiated a dedicated effort to identify actions that would ensure a successful 2018, while also implementing the continuous improvement framework that will help to secure decades of future success. This Task Force continues to work with management and physician leadership with a goal of operating as efficiently and effectively as possible and this will require ongoing dedication from all members of the Sansum Clinic team.

Some outcomes of this work include more actively helping to manage internal referrals to ensure patients receive the care recommended by their Sansum primary care providers, and working with payors to help ensure our successful participation in population health management programs. This work led to expansion of our Urgent Care hours and implementation of a new two-way texting technology for patients and their care teams.

We look forward to ongoing improvement work that will help us continue to meet the needs of our patients, now and well into the future.

EXPANDED URGENT CARE HOURS

Sansum Clinic **expanded Urgent Care hours to 8:00 am to 7:00 pm every day of the week**, to better serve our patients with access to convenient medical care for urgent needs that don't require a visit to the emergency department. In 2018, **41,222** individual patients visited Urgent Care for **56,531** visits.

WELL AT SANSUM CLINIC

We introduced **WELL at Sansum Clinic** – our newest communication tool that connects patients to Sansum Clinic via two-way text messaging. We are now able to stay in touch with patients to confirm, cancel or reschedule appointments, enabling patients to communicate with us about appointments more efficiently and at their convenience. Patients are automatically enrolled with this secure communications tool.

EPIC Revenue Cycle

In 2011, Sansum Clinic implemented a state-of-the-art **Electronic Health Record System**, which we call **the Wave**, based on software from **Epic Systems**. We have worked diligently to improve on the platform and we are thrilled to be recognized as one of the most technically advanced organizations in the nation. This success provided the platform for us to carefully consider what else we could do to improve our technical abilities for our providers, our management and our patients. Over the next year, Sansum Clinic will be implementing new software from Epic which is designed to improve registration, scheduling, billing and patient engagement. We are excited about the opportunities this will afford our revenue cycle operations, and how these new tools will improve the patient experience. We currently have over 91,000 patients using MyChart. With our new set of tools, patients will be able to schedule appointments online, ask to be notified of cancellations, pay their bills online (or request a payment plan) and request estimates for services. These are just a few of the enhanced services we will be able to offer. All of this helps build a robust platform for future opportunities to provide our providers, staff and patients with the best tools on the market.

Business Continuity and Disaster Recovery

Given Sansum's increasing dependency on information technology to run operations, the IT Department received full board approval for a **Business Continuity and Disaster Recovery** program to limit risk and ensure continuity of patient care in the event of an unexpected interruption.

Sansum had outgrown its existing data center and the new program, which utilizes the premier vendor of hosted data services, will include hardware, the virtual environment and circuit installation with bidirectional data circuits. It will also provide increased disaster recovery protection because it is based outside of our region. The first systems to go live in 2019 in the new data center will be the electronic health record system, the Wave, including secondary failover hardware for the Wave. The Clinic's revenue cycle system is slated to go-live in early 2020.

Data Warehouse and Analytics

Sansum's **Data Warehouse** came to the forefront of clinic operations in 2018, becoming the data source for combined financial and clinical reporting. This was a crucial step towards ensuring we meet the ever increasing challenges in the healthcare landscape. Payers grade us on our ability to deliver value-based care. This means payers expect our quality of care to be high and delivery of healthcare services to be as efficient as possible in terms of cost and utilization. To meet both aspects of the value-based care challenge, it is imperative that we have clear, near real-time visibility into our clinical quality performance as well as the resource utilization and access dimensions associated with delivering high-quality services to different patient populations. Within specific patient populations, reporting from the Data Warehouse can demonstrate visit and access statistics, utilization of preventive services, clinical quality performance, payer reimbursement, in addition to many other details within the Value-Based Care framework. Having access to this combined information supports our leadership in making timely decisions to stay on track towards meeting our goals.

Rheumatology Ultrasound Expansion

The **Rheumatology Department** expanded services in Solvang by adding ultrasound technology that ensures Sansum Clinic is able to provide the same level of Rheumatology service everywhere it is offered.



New Technology

Health Records on iPhone

Sansum Clinic collaborated with Apple on a new health records feature in the iPhone Health app. **Health Records on iPhone**, brings together hospitals, clinics and the existing Apple Health app to provide our patients who are active on **MyChart** with access to their records in the Apple Health app, so they can view their own personal health data from all participating health institutions in one place. Sansum Clinic has more than 91,000 patients using MyChart, and this new feature will be available to all of those who use iPhones and receive care at any of our 22 patient care facilities.

Previously, patients' medical records were stored in multiple locations, requiring patients to log into each care provider's website and piece together the information manually. Apple worked with the healthcare community to take a consumer friendly approach and created Health Records based on FHIR (Fast Healthcare Interoperability Resources), a standard for transferring electronic medical records.

Now, patients will have medical information from participating institutions

organized into one view, covering allergies, conditions, immunizations, lab results, medications, procedures and vitals, and will receive notifications when their data is updated. Health Records data is encrypted and protected with the user's iPhone passcode, Touch ID or Face ID.

Radiology Equipment Upgrade

The Sansum Clinic **Radiology Department** completed an ambitious technology upgrade by converting from computed radiography to digital radiography clinic-wide. The conversion allowed us to meet the **Consolidate Appropriations Act of 2016**, which incentivizes organizations to transition from computed radiography to digital radiography. Digital radiography technology benefits patients with state of the art imaging equipment and a decrease in radiation dose in general radiology by more than 35%. The new technology also offers an increase in efficiency. It used to take about five minutes to complete a routine chest x-ray with computed radiography equipment. Digital radiography allows for the same exam to be completed within one minute, which enables us to provide services to more patients in a shorter amount of time.

At Sansum Clinic, our patient-centered culture is the



intersection of who we are and what we do. As a healthcare organization, we provide *health* and we provide *care* – making sure that our patients and colleagues feel well cared for. In October 2018 the Executive Team introduced a new communications philosophy called **WE CARE** to provide staff and physicians with tools to help us all care for our patients in a way that carries them along their best possible health journey. Initial WE CARE training was centered on the kinds of behaviors and interactions we are hoping will become even more integral to how we conduct business and patient care.

During the Clinic's inaugural WE CARE Month, more than **850 staff** attended one of **19 WE CARE training sessions** at the Wolf Education and Training Center at Ridley-Tree Cancer Center at Sansum Clinic. **Seventy-four staff** were recognized as WE CARE Champions for embodying the Sansum Clinic mission, vision and values. Survey data showed that staff were thrilled to have an opportunity to enhance their customer service and patient experience skills. WE CARE has been incorporated into all job descriptions and our employee evaluation tool. Many staff report that the WE CARE philosophy has become a standard part of their daily work throughout the Clinic with patients and colleagues alike.

Coastal One Health Partners



Coastal One Health Partners (COHP) is a Track 1+

accountable care organization (ACO), formed in 2018

between Sansum Clinic and Cottage Hospital to enhance the care and services provided to the fee for service Medicare population. COHP has successfully completed the first year of a three year program. The success of the ACO, as measured by Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS), depends upon how effectively we are meeting the "triple aim" of healthcare, defined as providing high quality care, an excellent patient experience and appropriate resource utilization (e.g., the right care, at the right time, in the right setting).

For the first year of performance, CMS requires that the ACO is able to successfully report on all of the metrics that are being evaluated by CMS, such as clinical quality measurements and patient experience surveys. In subsequent years, not only will the ACO need to successfully report on all of the metrics but will also need to demonstrate year over year improvement on the clinical quality and patient experience metrics and performance will be compared against other ACO's nationwide. In addition, CMS evaluates appropriate resource utilization by monitoring the Medicare claims of the attributed membership to determine if care is being provided in the most appropriate and cost effective setting. Performance to date demonstrates that our ACO performs in the top quartile nationally on clinical quality and resource use metrics with significantly lower unplanned hospital admissions, and lower hospital and skilled nursing facility re-admission rates.

One of the great benefits of the ACO is the collaboration that has resulted as part of the COHP work groups, which crosses the continuum of care from in-patient to out-patient and skilled nursing facility. By getting everyone around the table we have been able to identify issues that impact the care of our collective patients and make improvements that we believe will translate into the triple aim of healthcare.







Sansum Clinic in the Community

Sansum Clinic strives to provide quality patient care and high standards for the communities we serve. We have a long standing commitment to meet the needs of the low income, uninsured, and underinsured patients in our community through our Charity Care Program. We have a policy that provides guidelines for identifying patients who may qualify for assistance and also establishes the financial screening criteria with an objective of providing care regardless of a patient's ability to pay.

In our commitment to provide 'good health for everyone' we offer flu shots through our community-wide Flu Shot Program conducted every fall and winter. Annual seasonal flu vaccines are the best way to reduce the chances that individuals will get seasonal flu and spread it to others. When more people get vaccinated against the flu, less flu can spread, resulting in better health and well-being for the residents of our community.



Sansum Clinic is proud to partner with the Santa Barbara Neighborhood Clinics (SBNC) providing them with free diagnostic services for their patients who have no health insurance. This type of partnership is rarely available to safety net providers elsewhere in the country.

SBNC is an independent, nonprofit healthcare organization dedicated to providing high quality, affordable, medical, behavioral health and dental care to those in need in Santa Barbara County, regardless of one's ability to pay.

SBNC serves 1 in 10 people in the community. Over 22,000 patients are cared for at four medical clinics, two dental clinics and three intermittent clinics.

Since 2010 Sansum Clinic has provided **5,554 SBNC patients** with **6,782 diagnostic** services totaling over **\$2.8 million**. The cardiology diagnostic services include

echocardiogram and cardiovascular device monitoring and other diagnostic services such as general and special radiology, MRI scans, CT scans, low-dose CT, ultrasounds and mammograms.

In 2019 the Clinic reinstated the colonoscopy screening program at SBNC in partnership with the Cancer Foundation of Santa Barbara.



In 2018 Sansum Clinic partnered with **Santa Barbara Vision Care (SBVC)**, a local health program that serves as part of SEE International's domestic programs to host the annual Veterans Day Vision Clinic. Six Sansum Clinic physicians performed eye exams to **56 in-need patients** at the Clinic's **Elings Eye Center**. Vouchers for free eye glasses were provided to **43 people** from Goleta Valley Optical and Blue Planet Eyewear donated sunglasses to patients.

In 2019 Sansum Clinic established a new program to provide eye care services, at no cost, to patients of SEE International who have no health insurance. This new program will replace the annual Veterans Day Vision Clinic.



Culture of Collaboration

Doctors Without Walls/Santa Barbara Street Medicine

This nonprofit organization's mission is to provide free, volunteer medical care for the most vulnerable underserved community members of Santa Barbara County. Doctors Without Walls/Santa Barbara Street Medicine (DWW-SBSM) has worked to overcome barriers to care that often inhibits people from accessing services by going to where the care is needed such as community parks. Education and training is provided to DWW-SBSM volunteers in order to promote the practice of humanitarian medicine.

The volunteers are able to meet, serve, and build trust while providing medical care. DWW-SBSM is able to fulfill their mission thanks to the partnership with Sansum Clinic. Sansum's physicians and medical staff volunteer their time which allows DWW-SBSM to expand their reach within the community.

In 2018, DWW-SBSM provided medical care to approximately 1,300 underserved residents in the community.

2018 Health Education Annual Report

The Health Education Department improves the quality of life of patients and the community by encouraging healthy choices, assisting in the management of ongoing health conditions and providing support and information for serious illness. Additionally, Health Education facilitates the physicians' ability to provide quality care by delivering the education and support component and provides a significant community service, offering many programs that are open to the community and free of charge or offered for a nominal fee. The work of the Health Education Department supports initiatives such as Patient Centered Medical Home, Pay for Performance, Physician Quality Reporting System and Population Health Management.

SERVICES PROVIDED

In 2018 the **Health Education Department** provided services to approximately **9,500 people** as follows:

- Individual professional consultations were provided in the areas of advance care planning, care management, diabetes and nutrition to 4,900 people.
- Group education and support programs were provided in 19 topic areas to 2,100 participants.
- Health Resource Center provided information to approximately 1,500 people. Popular topics requested by visitors include Sansum Clinic Services and Advance Directive assistance.
- Community-based health events provided resources to 1,000 people.
- Staff volunteered 100 hours to community health improvement committees and events.

Medicare Advantage Stars for High Performance



Sansum Clinic was recognized for providing **high quality care to Medicare Advantage** patients by the Integrated Healthcare Association (IHA), a statewide nonprofit group committed to high-value, integrated care that improves quality and affordability for patients across California and the nation. Each year, IHA recognizes physician organizations that achieve a 4.5- or 5-star rating. Sansum Clinic attained a **4.5 star** rating out of a possible 5 stars for 2017-18.

Building on the Medicare Advantage (MA) star rating system for health plans, IHA uses a subset of 13 clinical quality measures to collect performance data and assign star ratings to 186 physician organizations based on how well they provided recommended care to more than 2 million California seniors and people with disabilities enrolled in MA health maintenance organizations (HMOs).

Clinical quality measures used to calculate the star ratings range from rates of breast and colorectal cancer screenings to eye exams and blood sugar control for patients with diabetes to managing osteoporosis in women with a previous fracture.

Collecting these measures at the physician organization level allows IHA to combine data from the six participating health plans to identify performance variations that can help plans and physician organizations target quality improvement efforts.

APG Elite Status

Sansum Clinic was recognized for the fifth consecutive

year for its achievement of Elite status for the **2018 APG Standards of Excellence™**survey. America's Physician Groups (APG) is the largest association in the country

representing physician organizations practicing capitated, coordinated care.

Each year, APG assesses tools and processes its members have in place to meet

escalating expectations of healthcare purchasers and patients.

The annual **Standards of Excellence™ (SOE)** survey requires its participating members to report data across six rigorous category domains: Care Management, Information Technology, Accountability and Transparency, Patient Centered Care, and Group Support of Advanced Primary Care and Administrative and Financial Capability.

Sansum Clinic is in the company of world-class institutions like Cedars-Sinai Medical Group, Scripps Physicians Medical Group, Sutter Medical Foundation – Sutter Health and UCLA Medical Group that have also been recognized with Elite status.

Target: BP Recognition



Sansum Clinic was recognized by the **American Heart Association (AHA)** and **American Medical Association (AMA)'s Target: BP Recognition Program** as one of 300 medical practices in the nation for its commitment to reducing the number of patients who have heart attacks and strokes each year.

The Target: BP program is aimed at addressing the growing burden of high blood pressure in the U.S. Of the 103 million Americans with high blood pressure, only about

half of them have it controlled to a healthy level despite the fact that high blood pressure can often be managed effectively when patients work with their physician to create and follow a treatment plan. No single risk factor has more impact on the nation's death rates from cardiovascular disease than blood pressure.

This achievement is a credit to many physicians and staff within the organization. Primary care providers, nephrologists and cardiologists work directly with patients who are managing BPs in our patients, while the Sonar Clinical Quality Team extracts the data from the electronic health record. Sansum Clinic is proud to be recognized as a leader in helping reduce the devastating impact of high blood pressure in terms of heart disease and stroke for patients in our community.

Patient-Centered Medical Home Recognition



In 2017 Sansum Clinic earned three-year recognition for all seven primary care departments from the **National Committee for Quality Assurance (NCQA)** for the successful redesign of our primary care services into the **Patient-Centered Medical Home** model of care. In this model, all aspects of patient care are coordinated through the primary care physician who leads a clinical care team that ensures patient needs are met, whether preventive, chronic or acute, and that this care is delivered in the right place, at the right time, and in the manner that best suits the patient's needs. We continue to follow all of the NCQA standards required for this recognition.

Institute for Medical Quality Accreditation



Sansum Clinic is in its third three-year accreditation by the **Institute for Medical Quality,** an independent, not-for-profit organization, which evaluates medical groups on ambulatory care standards that have been developed by physicians with special expertise in a wide range of ambulatory care settings. The standards are specific to the California practice setting reflecting current medical practice techniques, statutes governing the operation of ambulatory care facilities and regulations adopted by the Medical Board of California.

Sansum Clinic was recognized as a 9-Star organization for **Epic's "Gold Stars" program**, which recognizes organizations that have taken steps to adopt new features and workflows redesigned to improve system use (staff, providers and patients). 





Late last year, Sansum Clinic reached an agreement to transition our Lompoc building and clinical activities to Lompoc Valley Medical Center in order to provide a long-term stable platform for an excellent healthcare delivery system for the Lompoc Valley.

PHILANTHROPIC SUPPORT HAS ENABLED THE CLINIC TO:

- Build the Foothill Medical & Surgical Center and Elings Eye Center at the intersection of Foothill Road and Highway 154.
- Build the Ridley-Tree Cancer Center, a world-class regional diagnostic, treatment and research center, in partnership with the Cancer Foundation of Santa Barbara which celebrated its one year anniversary September 2018.
- Establish a new Pain Management Department that takes a multi-disciplinary approach to treating all kinds of acute or chronic pain.
- Establish a Palliative Care and Advance Care Planning Program to enhance the quality of life for patients who are being treated for a serious illness by addressing their physical, emotional, social and spiritual needs.
- Double the size of our Urgent Care department, expanded hours to 8am to 7pm every day, and initiated same-day appointments to better meet patients' needs.
- Expand our Primary Care capacity in the newly updated clinic at 215 Pesetas Lane,

- Recruit dozens of new physicians, over the last decade alone, through shared-appreciation home loans as part of the Physician Housing Program supported by Sansum Clinic's Lovelace Fund for Medical Excellence, resulting in a medical staff of more than 150 specialists in nearly 40 specialties.
- Modernize our facilities to enhance the patient experience at the Pediatrics and Adolescent Medicine and Allergy Departments on Hitchcock Way; Obstetrics and Gynecology on Pueblo Street and the Oncology Department in Solvang.

- Purchase two mammogram machines and the Invenia Automated Breast
 Ultrasound System that provides advanced breast screening.
- Purchase an emergency generator at Pesetas Lane as part of Santa Barbara's Emergency Preparedness Program.
- Establish the Prescription Navigator Program, a pharmacist-led medication therapy management program that ensures the safe, effective, and appropriate use of medications by patients.
- Advance the level of surgical care available in our community through Sansum Clinic's Visiting Professor of Surgery Education Program that brings national and international experts to our community for one week each year.
- Create an education fund to provide clinical and non-clinical staff with unique personal and professional development opportunities that will expand their value within the Clinic and create a stronger and more dynamic platform for healthcare delivery.
- Provide the underserved residents of our community who have no health insurance with free diagnostic services and colonoscopy screenings through our partnership with the Santa Barbara Neighborhood Clinics.
- Provide free eye care to the underserved residents of our community with no health insurance through our partnership with SEE International.
- Offer Health Education Programs free or at a nominal fee.

Within Sansum Clinic and Ridley-Tree Cancer Center our physicians and staff established the **Employee Assistance Fund** and contributed voluntary gifts of paid time off and cash that enabled us to replenish a large percentage of paid time off and wages lost as a result of the Thomas Fire and debris flow for those unable to get to work. We remained fully operational during that time as a result of our dedicated staff.



The **Lovelace Fund for Medical Excellence** is used for programs that assist Sansum Clinic in the recruitment and retention of physicians, including the **Physician Housing and the Facility Improvement Programs**. It is also used for other endeavors which are deemed to ensure medical excellence for our patients.

Sansum Clinic's Board of Trustees established The Lovelace Fund for Medical Excellence in 2012 as a tribute to the late Jon Lovelace and the Lovelace Family for their visionary support of Sansum Clinic.

In addition to the Lovelace Family we also receive support from a number of other community contributors, including our Trustees who have embraced the vision of the Lovelace Family in supporting Sansum Clinic.

The Lovelace Fund for Medical Excellence and the Physician Housing and Facility Improvement Programs help provide a lasting legacy to Sansum Clinic and Santa Barbara and the more than 130,000 patients who trust us with their medical care each year. It also enables the Clinic to keep pace with the rapidly changing healthcare environment, and anticipating the community's needs.

Physician Housing Program

This program assists new physicians in obtaining shared appreciation loans to help with the purchase of homes in our high-priced real estate market. The 26 physicians who used loans last year saw 37,034 unique patients at 91,298 patient visits in Cardiology, Dermatology, Gastroenterology, General Surgery, Hematology/Oncology, Infectious Diseases, Internal Medicine, Neurology, Obstetrics and Gynecology, Ophthalmology, Orthopedics, Pulmonary/Critical Care and Rheumatology.

A Cardiologist was named **Physician of the Year by Cottage Health** and another Cardiologist was a *Pacific Coast Business Times* Healthcare Champion.

The physician housing program has been designed to be a revolving fund, whereby the proceeds from future home sales will be used to repay outstanding loans and flow back into the program, where they can be used again to help future physicians meet their housing needs.

Facility Improvement Program

This program assists us in modernizing our facilities to enhance our patients' experience and support our ongoing efforts to attract the highest caliber physicians from around the United States. We refreshed our clinic at 317 West Pueblo Street and relocated certain departments to provide additional capacity and improved access to timely appointments.

Professor Garden presented a public lecture on Edinburgh's Illuminati:




